New Business:

Chamber:

Village:

- Butler Street Reconstruction Project starting curbing tomorrow, hopeful for concrete next week, asphalt in about 2 weeks. 4 way stop – poles for new stop light won't be here until August when the project is wrapping up
- Water Tower painters/coating end of May/July is goal to be done
- Sidewalk Project Sharpsburg/49 still working on and hopeful for early 2026 to get started.
- Assistant Village Administrator position has been filled. Aaron Rengers is going to be starting May 12th. He comes with a variety of background, he was in the service, operating heavy equipment, then worked for Jutte Excavating and is currently at the City of Piqua.
- Village purchased parking lot between new Restaurant and Ted Homan's property on Butler Street for more public parking. Will add 7-8 spots downtown.
- Working on the safe routes to school project as well.

School:

- FFA students are heading to National Convention later this week
- Graduation is May 18th, with 77 seniors graduating, 56% are going to college, while the other 44% are going straight to the workforce.
- Talked about the State Budget and watching it closely as there are some changes being suggested.

Merchants:

- The Bunny Hop had about 150 candy sacks go out, eggs in the windows winners were announced and all extra candy was donated to the library.
- Talked about the Shop Local Bags
